2. Hazards Identification

Emergency Overview

The potential for exposure is reduced in finished pharmaceutical form. However, effects of exposure may include high/low blood pressure, irregular heartbeat, allergic reactions, Methemoglobinemia and DNA damage.

Signs and symptoms of overexposure include metoclopramide-restlessness, drowsiness, fatigue, weariness, insomnia, headache, confusion, dizziness, mental depression, endocrine disturbances, nausea, bowl disturbances (diarrhea), loss of bladder control, disorientation, muscle spasms, incoordination, rash, welts, difficulty breathing.

Eye:

Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, lifting lower and upper eyelids occasionally. Obtain medical attention immediately.

Skin:

Immediately flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing. Wash clothing before reuse.

Inhalation:
